World Book Day 2022

Thursday 3rd March is going to be a big celebration, the 25th anniversary of World Book Day.

We always celebrate the day in style with various events for our pupils to get involved in and 2022 will be no different. Make a note in your diaries and encourage your child(ren) to get involved where they can.


1. Dress up

Pupils will be given the chance to come dressed as their favourite book character on the day (this is optional).

2. "The Spoon"

Last year's "The Masked Reader" was a huge hit. This year, staff at St. Barnabas have created a new show for our pupils to enjoy on the day. Look out for this on our website soon!

WOODEN SPOON



Pupils can pay £1 to enter this exciting competition. They will be provided with a wooden spoon (ordered in advance) and challenged to decorate/ dress up their wooden spoon as their favourite book character. There will be prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in First School and Middle School. Wooden spoons must be ordered by Friday 18th February so that children have just under 2 weeks to get creative. Send your £1 with your child's name and class to Mrs Reeder by the deadline.



4. Golden Ticket

For Year 3 and upwards, Mrs James will be hiding golden tickets in 10 books in the school library. If found, the pupils will earn 2 house points. They then have 24 hours to read that particular book and quiz on it. They need to score 80% or above to win a prize.

From Preschool - Y2, the golden tickets will be hidden in their class reading books. If found, the pupils will earn 2 house points and can help to read the book aloud to the class with their teacher on World Book Day.

International Book Giving Day

International Book Giving Day takes place on 14th February each year. The aim of the day is to share the love of books and to get books into the hands of as many children as possible.

We are asking for you to raid your bookshelves at home and donate any unwanted ones in a bag to our school library.

All donating families will receive a special Valentine's card from our Junior Librarians as a 'thank you'. Please make sure we know who you are by adding a note to your bag!

5. Whole-school "Handmade Book Swap" On World Book Day, we will be launching our "Handmade Book Swap". Each class will be provided with a handmade book. Each class will decide on a generic theme for their book, e.g., insects. Each class will complete the first double-page spread on the theme. The doublepage may include: a piece of writing, a piece of artwork and some factual information, e.g., a poem about a butterfly, a drawing and a fact about butterflies. Every fortnight, the book will be passed onto the next class and they will complete the next double-page (sticking to the theme but creating a different page), e.g., the honeybee. At the start of the Summer term, we should have 9 completed books to exhibit in school. We cannot wait for you to see them!

Overdue Library Books

We would like to take the opportunity to ask you to look for any school library books which might be hiding on a bookcase at home. The majority of these books will have an orange sticker on the bottom of the spine.

If you have received a letter from the library team about overdue library books and your child is unable to locate them, then please use ParentPay as a means of payment.

COVID-19 Updates

We would like to thank all our parents and guardians for being so vigilant with looking out for covid-19 symptoms and testing regularly. We take the health and safety of our pupils and staff very seriously and, with your help we continue to reduce the introduction of the virus into our school community, where possible.

Isolation Periods

As from the 17th January the self-isolation Guidance changed. It is possible to end self-isolation after 5 full days if you have 2 negative LFD tests taken on consecutive days. The first LFD test should not be taken before the 5th day after your symptoms started (or the day your test was taken if you did not have symptoms). The self-isolation period remains 10 full days for those without negative results from 2 LFD tests taken a day apart.

PAEDIATRIC INFLAMMATORY MULTISYSTEM SYNDROME (PIMS)


PIMS is a new and very rare condition that happens 4-6 weeks after a child has tested positive for COVID-19 and likely remained well with no symptoms of the virus. PIMS causes inflammation throughout the body. PIMS can be treated with medical help, trust your instincts, you know your own child.

The main symptom of PIMS is a high temperature that lasts for a number of days which you'll find you cannot control at home with over the counter medication. Your child might also have other symptoms such as:

Term Dates

Please find attached the 2022-2023 Term dates. We'd like to remind you that holidays should be booked around the school breaks and fines could be incurred for holiday taken during school term time.

Healthy Eating

Reminder that breaktime snacks should be fresh fruit or vegetables only. Crisps, biscuits and cereal bars should not be eaten at breaktime. These items should only be included as part of your child's lunch.

The Department of Health and Social Care have launched a multimedia Better Health campaign to encourage families to eat better and improve children's diets. The campaign includes a new 'scan, swipe and swap' feature on the NHS Food Scanner App, to help families maintain a healthier diet. Families can scan the product barcodes from their shop and the app will suggest healthier alternatives to help them make an easy swap next time they shop. The app uses a "Good Choice" badge to help signpost people to healthier food and drinks in line with the government's dietary recommendations for added sugar, saturated fat and salt. The campaign follows a record rise in obesity amongst children since the start of the pandemic, with latest data highlighting that one in four (27.7%) children of reception school age are overweight or obese; this rises to four in 10 (40.9%) in year six (ages 10-11).
