## New COVID Isolation Guidelines

At the end of February, we came back to school with another ease on restrictions and new guidance for isolation. With this knowledge we have continued to be reactive to COVID cases in school and adapt to ensure we are working within the guidelines. As of this week we have stopped emailing parents when there is a positive case in a class, as we feel our school community is learning to live with COVID. Those that test positive are required to isolate and not come to school for a minimum period of five full days, starting the day after either a positive test or when symptoms began (this is classed as day zero). The DFE have confirmed that children can return to school once they have one negative lateral flow result following these 5 full days of isolation, i.e. day 6. We'd like to thank you all for adhering to these measures and helping to keep all within school safe.

## Art Competition

As a school, we are entering a competition to win a £5000 playground makeover. To enter, we have to create a large-scale piece of artwork based on the theme: Message in a Bottle. This artwork must depict how sea life is affected by plastic in our oceans. As a result, we are in need of as many plastic bottle tops as possible to create our scene. All colours, shapes and sizes welcome. Please make sure they are thoroughly cleaned before sending them in. There will be 2 'Drop Off' buckets: one in the Art Room for Year 3 to Year 7 children; one in the FS Hall for Preschool to Year 2 children. Your child can drop bottle tops off at any time and as many times as they wish. The final day for bottle top donations will be April 8<sup>th</sup>. 


## Drakes Broughton & Wadborough With Pirton Parish Council

## Science Week


St Barnabas took part in the British Science Week between Monday 14th March and Monday 21st March. Each group took part in a different activity linked to this year's theme: 'Growth'. Activities included gardening, making slime, discovering about the brain and illusions and life on Mars.

Year 7 took part in a live lesson hosted by Worcester University and took part in different practical activities. Pictures of some of these activities have been shared on Google Classroom. Each teacher looked out for students who showed excellent science and enquiry skills and these students were awarded certificates in the celebration assembly at the end of the week. As well as this, we held a poster competition linked to the theme of 'Growth'. Two children from each class were selected for their amazing posters and they were given an award at the end of the week. These posters will also be submitted into the national British Science Week poster competition and they have been shared on Google Classroom.

On Monday 21st March we were visited by the Science Education Group. Years 4, 5 and 7 took part in a science workshop about Space in which they were able to explore the solar system through virtual reality headsets! This activity went down very well with the children! Thank you to the St Barnabas Friends group for funding the Space workshop.

Year 7 students visited London on Tuesday 22nd March. This was an amazing opportunity after the last two years of so many restrictions. With an early start of 7am, the students' fun-packed day involved a coach tour of London, a tour of the Houses of Parliament, making a "flight" on the London Eye and picnic lunch in Jubilee Gardens.

At the Houses of Parliament, Parliament Education Centre staff ran a tour and workshop with the students, which also involved an interesting film about the story of parliament - a great way for students to consolidate what they have been learning in History with Mrs Reeder and PSHCE lessons with Mrs Richards. After their tour, the students were met by Nigel Huddleston, Conservative MP for Mid Worcestershire, who was very kind to use his break between important meetings to run a Q&A session in one of the private committee rooms. Nigel was asked many thought-provoking questions about his time before becoming an MP, his views on the Prime Minister and his attitude towards the protestors who were loudly campaigning outside the gates.



The beautiful Spring day made the walk across Westminster Bridge really enjoyable and taking in the sights of Central London was a hit with everyone. It was wonderful to see so many people enjoying the city! The flight on the London Eye was truly spectacular. Mr Booth and Mrs Harding have been going on this trip for many years and both agreed that this was the best view that they had ever had. Finally, ice creams in Jubilee Gardens finished the day off beautifully. It was a really long day - arriving back in school just before 7.30pm but everyone had a fabulous time. Once again, we were extremely proud of how Year 7 students conducted themselves and we have already received great praise from Nigel Huddleston's Office Manager via email.
